

What is anti-slavery statement:

At the end of October 2015, the Home Office published statutory guidance on the new requirement under section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the "Act") for larger commercial organisation to produce an anti-slavery and human trafficking statement. The new rules apply to organisations that are a 'body corporate' or a partnership, carrying on a business, or part of a business, in the UK which supplies goods and services, and which has an annual turnover of £36m or more.

The Act specifically states that the statement must include 'the steps the organisation has taken during the financial year to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in any of its supply chains, and in any part of its supply chain. However, this does not mean that the organisation in question must guarantee that the entire supply chain is slavery free. Instead, it means an organisation must set out the steps it has taken in relation to any part of the supply chain (that is, it should capture all the actions it has taken).

MSIEu Approach:

The proposed definition of MSIEu's supply chain is to exclude brokers and insureds from the list. At this moment, the core supply chain relationship exists with MS Amlin, which provides number of support services to the Company.

MSIEu statement:

In order to comply with the above requirements, the statement approved by the Board for the 2016 financial year end is a proposed to the Board for approval.

Statement:

The Company's Human Resource Policies reflects its commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all its business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in the Company. The Company encourages all its stakeholders to report any issues and/or concerns about potential violations of human rights, legal or regulatory requirements, and improper or unethical business practices.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes the Company's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31st December 2017.
